Local infiltration of the scalp after the usual shaving and cleansing. Neck prepared with iodine and alcohol. Cerebellar position was adequate and exposure good throughout. Usual cross-bow incision from mastoid tip to encircle the skull 3 cm. above the external occipital protuberance

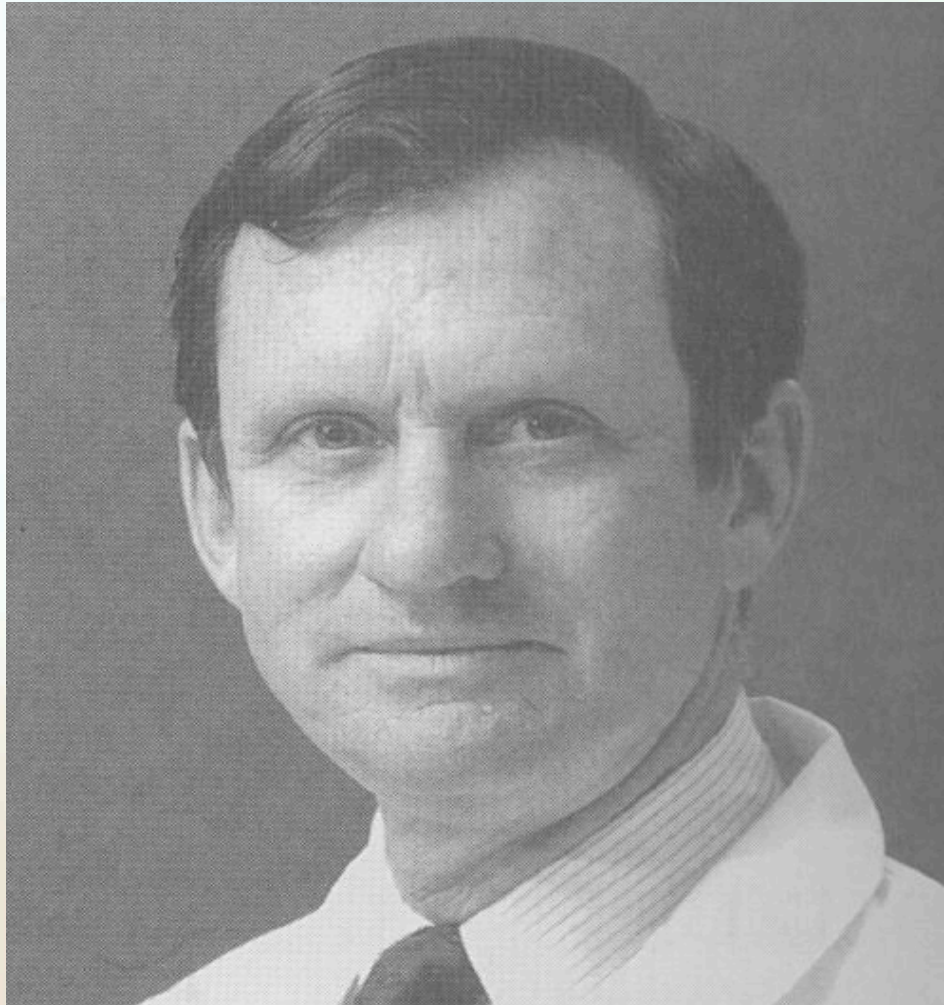

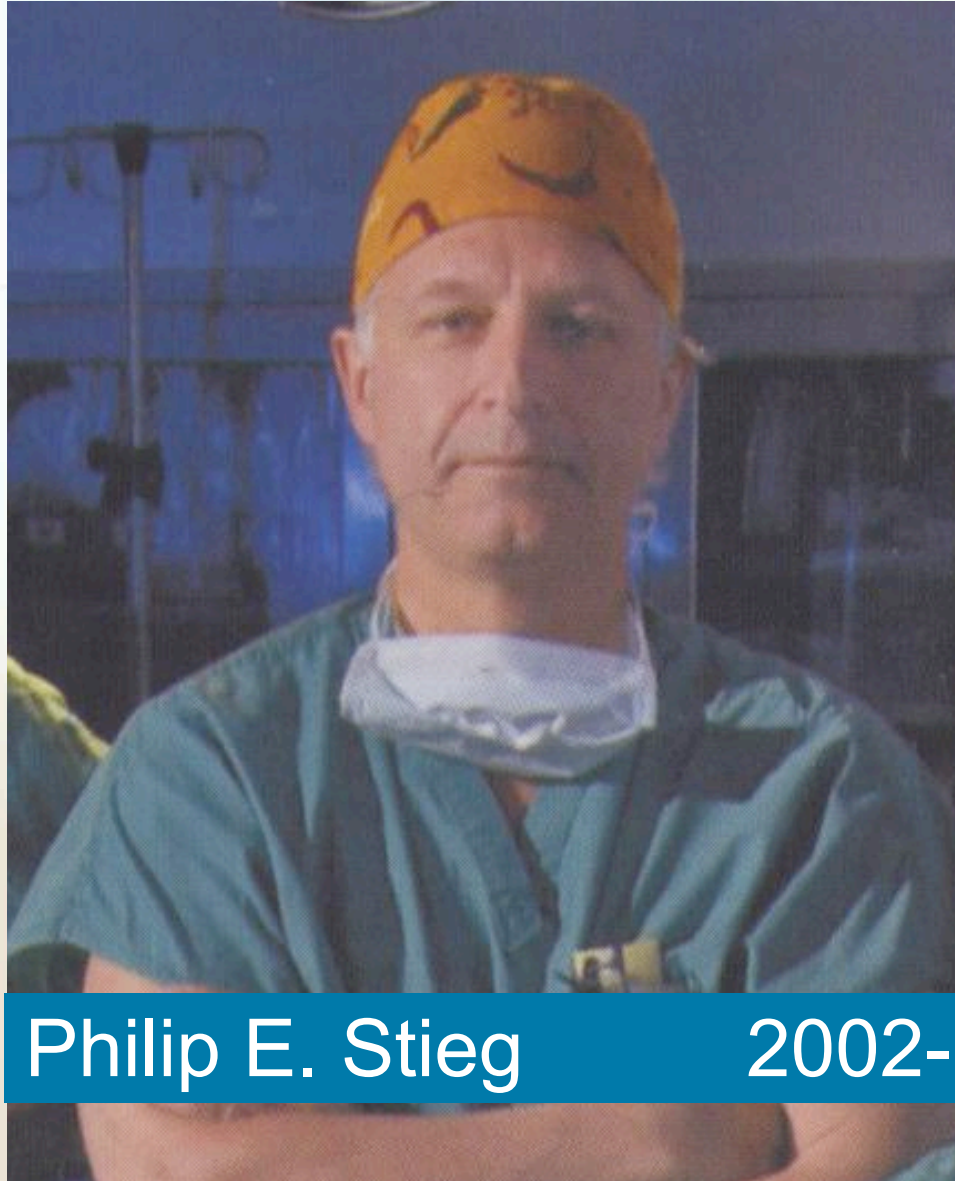
