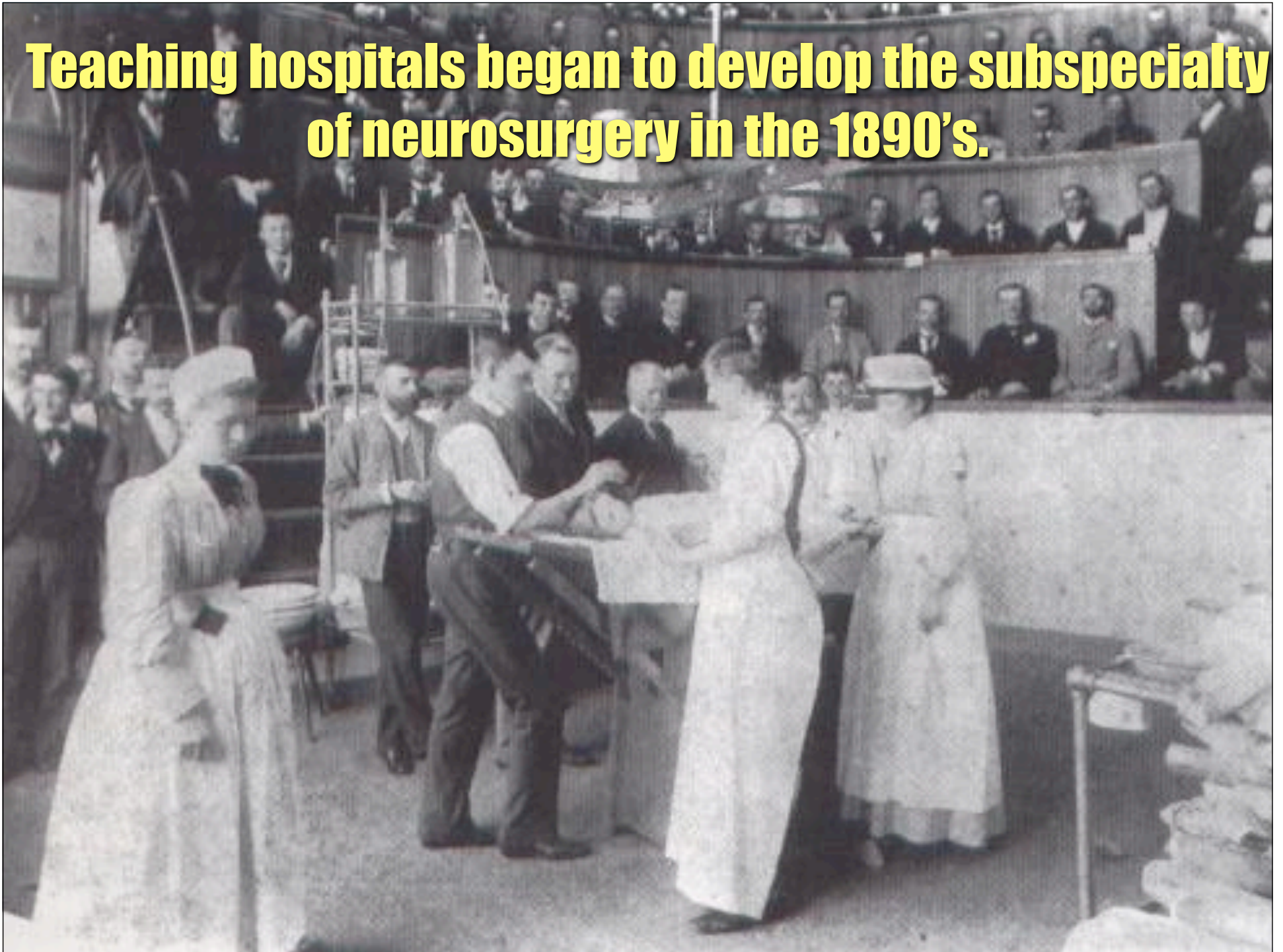


Teaching hospitals began to develop the subspecialty of neurosurgery in the 1890's.





The Mount Sinai Neurosurgery “Gang”

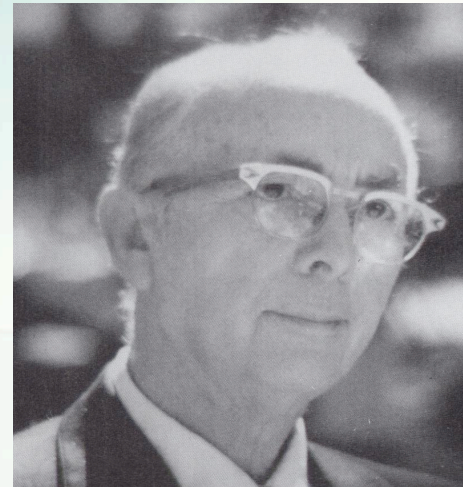
Mt. Sinai's Dept. of Neurosurgery had 6 chairmen in its nearly 100 year history.

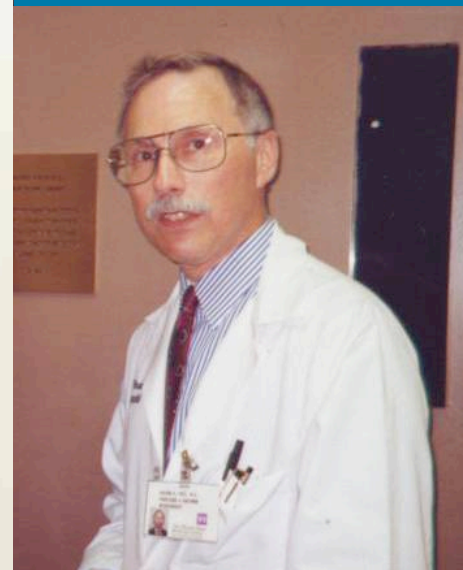

- Joseph Collins, Joseph Frankel, Pearce Bailey, and Charles Elsberg were the founding fathers.

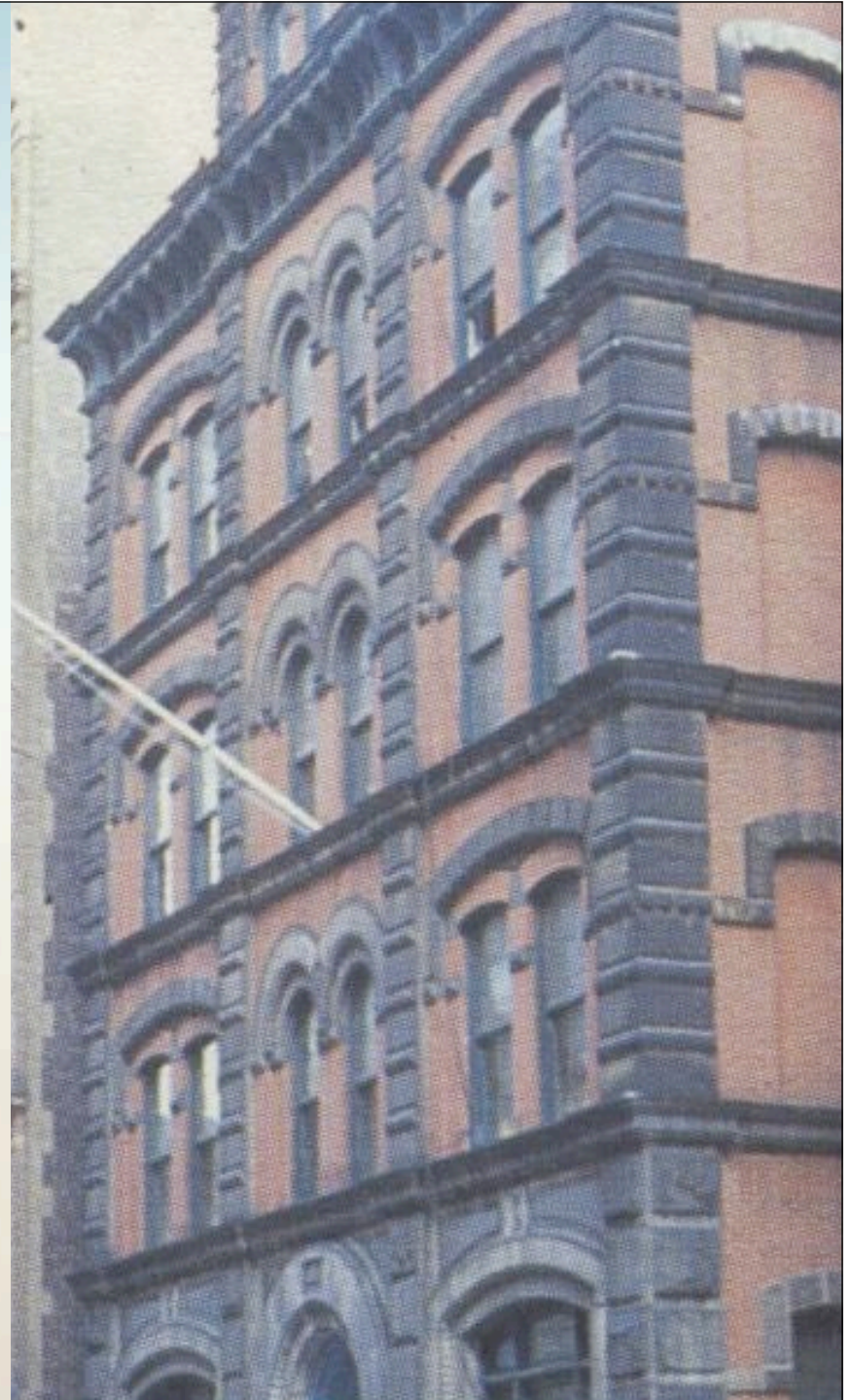


- Founded in 1909 as the first hospital in North America devoted exclusively to the care of patients afflicted with neurological diseases

cord tumor.

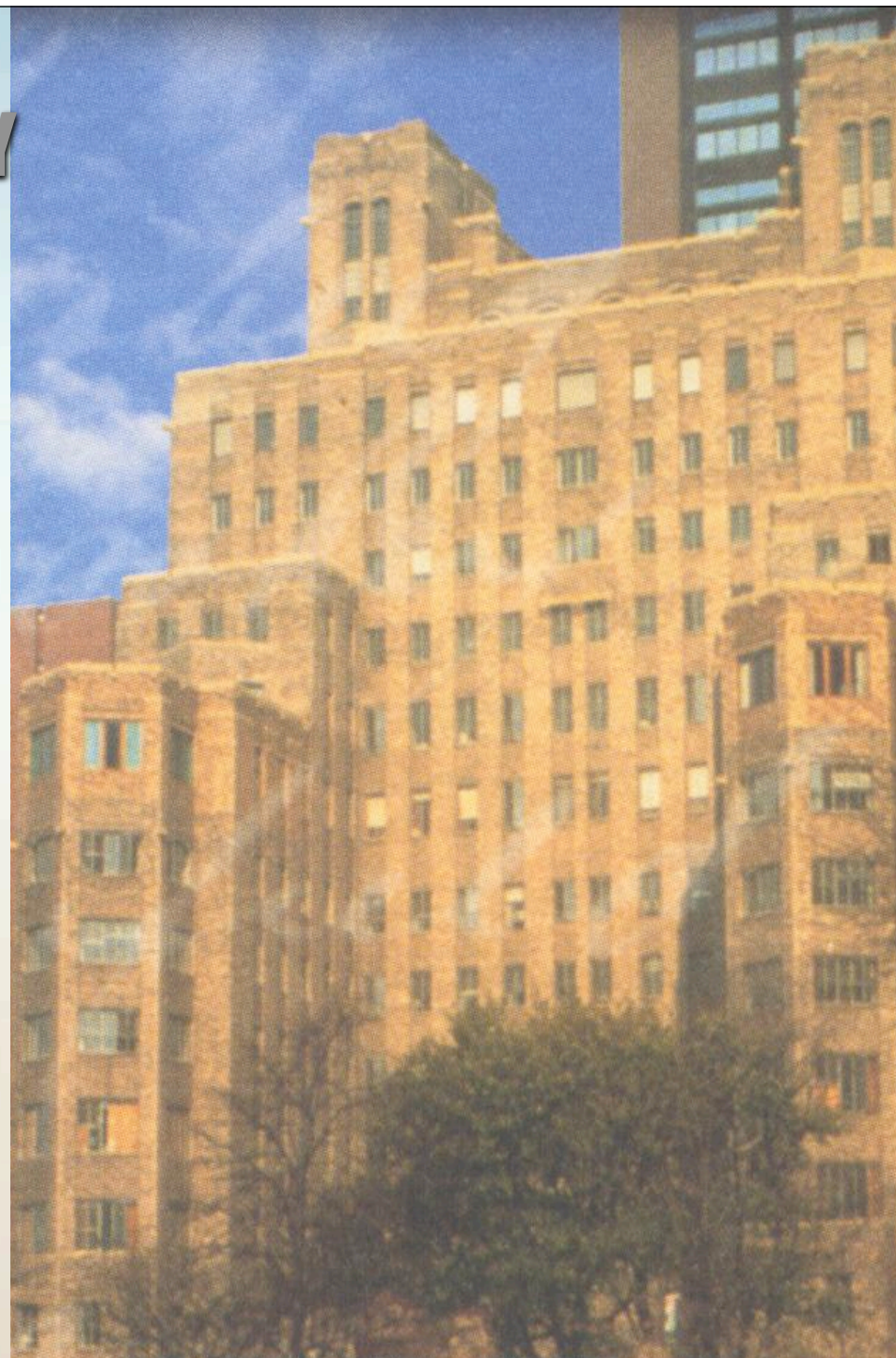

(NINY in 1929)**

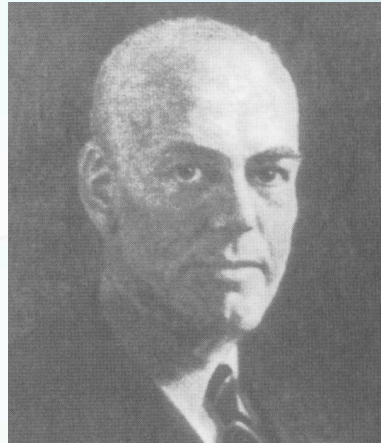
